From Father John

Beloved in Christ:

With the extreme heat conditions in the desert during the summer, all of us usually have one thing in mind - to head for the coast! For those of us who are unable to travel to Greece or even to make the five hour trip to the cool beaches, the next best thing is to take a dip in the swimming pool to relieve and reenergize us from the fatigue caused by the heat.

Similarly, we Christians often find ourselves fatigued from the scorching heat of our circumstances or our sins. Acknowledging that spiritual weariness is part of our fallen condition, the Orthodox Church provides an occasion at the peak of summer to receive spiritual refreshment. During the fourteen-day fast preceding the Feast of the Dormition (Kimisis – Falling Asleep) of the Virgin Mary on August



15, it is customary to gather in the Church to chant the Paraklesis (Intercessory Prayer) to the Most Holy Theotokos. According to the preface to the service, the Paraklesis is also to be chanted "in times of distress and sorrow." During the period of the fast, the Paraklesis will be chanted on Mondays, Wednesdays and *Fridays at 6:00 pm.* It is customary to bring a list of names among the living for the priest to commemorate. (Please use the form on Page 8.) The reason for this service is defined in the first melodic ode:

> With my temptations surrounding me, Searching for salvation, I have sought refuge in you; O Mother of the Word, and ever-Virgin, From all distresses and dangers deliver me.

Throughout the Ecclesiastical Year, from September through August, we have many opportunities for spiritual growth. Still, our life in Christ can be likened to sailing on a ship: There are times of calmness and there are periods of great tempests. The Church is to the Christian as the Ark was to Noah and his family – a place of refuge from the storms of this life, the powerful attacks of the evil one and the drowning weaknesses of our flesh. And no one understands our struggles and needs more than our Mother, the Panagia (All Holy One). Having already experienced the bodily resurrection, she joins her Son and God, our Lord Jesus Christ, in Heaven, ever concerned for our souls and praying before His Throne for our deliverance and redemption.

Whenever we are feeling beat up, exhausted or overwhelmed, our temptation may be to succumb to a state of spiritual lethargy. As this is dangerous to our soul and may result in death, let us make every effort to seek the refreshment that our Lord and His Mother so willingly offer us in the Church. The Prophet David writes: "Blessed is the man . . . (whose) delight is in the law of the Lord, and on His law he *meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water" (Psalm 1)* I pray that you and yours are continuously invigorated spiritually, not only in the remaining summer months but throughout your lives.



Building and Maintenance Committee

I hope everyone is enjoying their summer. Since June we have completed the remaining roof replacement over the Administrative portion of Panos Hall and part of Kokkos Hall, and begun the asphalt repaying of all our parking lots. Both these projects have cost roughly \$84,000.

We also have repaired the in-ground lights on and along the steps of the Church with new transformers (\$800), replaced another three irrigation valves and the water filters for the commercial ice machine (\$1,350).

As mentioned in last month's message, there are two additional projects we hope to also undertake. As you may have noticed, the front main fountain has deteriorated, and the pump recently went out. We have the funds for the concrete and sealant work for the fountains. This cost is \$5,000. For the tiling and pump we need an additional \$7,500. Also, the bollard lights, gate post and interior courtyard lighting all needs to be replaced. Many of the bollards are barely secure and thus pose a safety issue. Through the benevolence of two Stewards so far, we have secured \$6,500 of the \$25,000 needed to complete this project. Without your generous contributions we cannot continue the work necessary to keep and maintain our grounds and facilities looking their best.

Finally, we are grateful to Telly Eliades for donating a golf cart for maintenance use on the property.

If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to me anytime. May the rest of your summer be filled with joy and good memories.

Stewardship and Community Outreach

The Orthodox Christian Steward comes in many forms: Some are women, some men, some children, some rich, some poor, some illustrious and some lowly. But they all have one thing in common: They have given their lives wholly to Christ. *"There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male or female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:28)*

Their gifts have been varied, too – through monastic asceticism, charitable works, evangelism, or martyrdom for our Lord and Savior. The following Saints gave all, but before they reposed, they devoted their attentions to a life pleasing to our Lord. They proclaimed His Holy Name, they read His Word, they hoped in His Glory, they spread His Gospel, they performed healings in His Name, and they accomplished charitable works.

On July 17, we celebrate St. Marina, a fifteen year-old girl who endured imprisonment and torture to proclaim Who she belonged to. She was apprehended by the ruler of Olmbrius (3rd Century), and when asked her name, homeland, and faith, she answered: "My name is Marina; I am the offspring of the Pisidia; I call upon the Name of my Lord Jesus Christ." She was beheaded in 270 AD. She is invoked for deliverance for demonic possession.

On July 26, we remember St. Paraskevi of Rome, born on a Friday, hence her name (in Greek). Her name means "preparedness." Another young person, she devoted herself to studying the Divine Scriptures, guiding many to the Faith of Christ. She was apprehended during the reign of Emperor Antoninus Pius and urged to worship the idols, but she answered with the words of Prophet Jeremiah: "*Let the gods that have not made heaven and the earth perish from off the earth.*" (*Jeremiah 10:11*) Because of this she endured exceedingly painful torments and was beheaded in the year 140 AD. The faithful pray to her for the healing of eye ailments.



On August 1, the names of the Holy Maccabees Abim, Anthony, Guria, Eleazar, Eusebona, Achim, and Marcellus are honored. They were young people, Jews by race, and exact keepers of the Laws of the Fathers, and forced by the King of Syria to partake of swine's flesh, forbidden by Jewish Law. They suffered terrible tortures but endured for the sake of their hope in the Lord. After they were put to death, their mother cast herself into the fire to die with them, in the year 168 before Christ. *(2 Maccabees 7:21)*

On August 21, we remember the Apostle Thaddeus who came to Jerusalem and became a disciple of Christ. He preached in Mesopotamia, ending his life in martyrdom. Some call him one of the Twelve Apostles. *(Matthew 10:3)* He is also called one of the Seventy: After Christ's Resurrection from the dead, and His Ascent into Heaven, the Apostle Thomas sent Thaddaeus to Edessa as a preacher and evangelist of His teaching.

Where do we find ourselves in our journey as Christian Stewards? We all, according to God, have been given gifts to share. In this summer season, we see the contributions of young people in the quest to serve the Lord. May this be a call for the young people of our Parish to be inspired by these Saints to take up a challenge of Stewardship in its many forms.

"Stewardship does not mean being hit up for an annual pledge to the Church. It is not being enlisted in a financial campaign for the new building. It is not even tithing. Rather, it is a well-rounded view of life and an incarnation of that view based on theology and ecclesiology – the giving of time and talent and treasure. Thus, Stewardship is a state of being. It is based in service. The Steward is in the employ of his Master. Therefore, the most important aspect of being a Steward is serving." (http://www.oca.org/the-hub)

Dear Father John, Father Florin and Beloved Fellow Parishioners:

With every good intention this letter is intended to refresh the memory of our community and/or familiarize those of us who may be unaware of the history of the *Hellenic Historical Society*.

In 2003, at the Parish Assembly of that year, the *Hellenic Historical Society* (HHS) was established. From that time through 2009 a concentrated effort was made by our archivists to systematically collect and preserve the first 50 years of history of our St. John the Baptist Church Community and the Greek Community at large in Las Vegas and Nevada. This monumental undertaking guaranteed that our history has not been lost.

In 2009 our community was able to enjoy the fruits of that labor at the 50th Anniversary Celebration. During the 3day celebration of *Our Golden Heritage*, 740 chronologically ordered display boards with a program guide, presenting approximately 7,500 documents, letters, charters, books, photos, newspaper clippings, invitations, etc. were mounted on the walls of Panos Hall and on the walls of the foyer.

In 2019 at the 2-day 60th Anniversary Celebration of our community, *Our Diamond Jubilee*, we were able to further enjoy the fruits of that initial labor in addition to 50 new display boards. These displays were reproduced and those interested can find five large albums in the Church Library.

Please remember how valuable and interesting our story has been. Too many of us do not know of the events that led us to this magnificent Church where we are today. There are **many gaps in the history** which we would like to fill. To further preserve a more inclusive and detailed history we are asking the Parish Council, the Ministries and Pan Orthodox organizations to select a member of their body to act as historian to gather past, present and future records and to share these documents with the Hellenic Historical Society.

We welcome any and all submissions from any member of the community who has material pertinent to the St. John the Baptist Church Community and the Greek Community at large in Las Vegas and Nevada.

We look forward to receiving your historical materials. Please see the guidelines for your submissions.

We count on your continued support of this most important ministry.

Prosphora Baking

Dear Parish Members,

We have been blessed to have a handful of committed members who prepare and bake Prosphora, which through your prayers and the descent of the Holy Spirit becomes the Life-Giving Body of Christ that is distributed with His Blood to the faithful at each Divine Liturgy.

However, the number of people baking the Prosphora has dwindled, and there is a great need in our community for others to assist in this vital offering of Stewardship. In our Parish, we make it our goal to have freshly baked Prosphora for each Divine Liturgy.

Our current bakers are willing to teach others the process, and this is what is required:

- You must be a Baptized and Chrismated member of the Orthodox Church.
- You must be Sacramentally in good standing with the Church (if married, you are married in the Orthodox Church) and attending the Divine services faithfully.
- You must prepare the Prosphora according to the traditional recipe and do so prayerfully. You will be given the customary prayers.
- You must use the Seal on each loaf. Our current bakers will direct you where to find this.
- You must deliver the Prosphora in a timely manner (the day before or morning of the service, prior to the start of Orthros).

Although women often offer this service, men are also invited and encouraged to bake Prosphora. If you are willing to assist us in this sacred work over the summer, please contact Father John at the Church Office (702) 221-8245. If you are unable to help now, but still interested, please save the date for a training class held by Marcie Karas and Para Pouridis *on Saturday, September 23.*



From Father Florin

About a hundred years had passed in ancient Israel since the time of King David, who had set a high standard of faithfulness and integrity in serving the one true God. Around 870 BC, a king named Ahab did more to provoke God's anger than all the kings of Israel who had come before him. *(1 Kings 16:33)* The apostasy during Ahab's reign was the result of many years of corrupt and evil kings, and most of the people had yielded to Satan and his demons through their worship of the Canaanite gods, Baal and Ashtoreth. Still, God waited patiently for His people to separate themselves from the pagan influences that surrounded them and to return to true worship. *(1 Kings 14:6-16)* To announce the punishment and warn the nation to change its ways, God sent a messenger, St. Elijah (Elias) the Prophet.

St. Elijah's name means "Yahweh is God" or "The Lord is my God". He is first mentioned in Scripture when he declares to King Ahab that a severe drought would begin immediately to test Israel and its leadership. Withholding rain for three and one-half years was the first miracle God did through the Prophet, so the nation would repent of its idolatry.

St. Elijah the Tishbite was an ordinary man, with similar hopes and dreams, weaknesses, and shortcomings, but also a man of deep faith in God. He was a bold, direct-to-the-point prophet of God. By speaking the prophecies of God, he made fierce enemies. The Apostle James would later speak of Elijah's faith saying, *"Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain; and it did not rain on the land for three years and six months. And he prayed again, and the Heaven gave rain, and the Earth produced its fruit." (James 5:17-18)*

Another miracle attributed to St. Elijah involves a widow's bin of flour and jar of oil which, by the prayers of the Saint, were miraculously multiplied, and again by his prayers, her son resurrected. *(1 Kings 17:10-24)*

When directed by God to appear before King Ahab again, St. Elijah performed one of his greatest public miracles, which involved a contest with the 450 prophets of Baal and the 400 prophets of Asherah on Mount Carmel. Throughout the day, the false prophets called on their god to send down fire and consume an animal sacrifice, but to no avail. At the end of the day, Elijah called on Israel's God to send fire to swallow up the sacrifice prepared for Him. In a moment, thousands witnessed the fire from Heaven consume the carcass, all the water in the trench and all the wet wood, burning up even the stones! St. Elijah exposed the deception of the false prophets of Baal, and at last the hearts of the Israelites were convinced that only Israel's God could do



this miracle. Then God's Spirit moved Elijah to pray that it would rain; and the rains came, ending the terrible drought. *(I Kings 18:42-45; James 5:18)*

God used the Prophet Elijah to train his successor, Elisha. He found Elisha busily engaged in plowing. Approaching him suddenly, the Prophet threw his mantle over Elisha, a symbol of Elisha's call to the prophetic office. Elisha stayed with Elijah faithfully until the time God divided the Jordan and then took Elijah away with a chariot of fire. *(2 Kings 2:8-11)*

The world today still has its Ahabs and Jezebels. The present age also has its idolatry, though it is more subtle than that of Elijah's day. The shrines of pagan worship may not be as visible, and there may be very few carved images that people actually worship, yet millions are following after the gods of this world. Today's idols can be riches, fame, pleasure, and the pleasant-sounding fables that occupy the hearts and minds of many who are unwilling and disinterested in learning about God. At the time of the end, just before the great and dreadful day of God's Final Judgment, the world will again be given the same message of repentance and true faith that was preached by the Holy Prophet Elijah.

 - o I am attaching my Stewardship Commitment Card to this registration form.
- 3. The dancer must <u>on a regular basis participate</u> in Divine Liturgy on Sunday, throughout the year, and in Church School (if he or she is of age), <u>September through May</u>. Infrequent participation is a basis for removal from the program.
- 4. The dancer must arrive to practice <u>on time</u> and be <u>respectful</u>. The Greek Folk Dance Ministry has a strict **NO BULLYING** policy. This includes both verbal and physical bullying. Any dancer participating in bullying will be subject to removal from the program.

- 5. The dancer and parent(s) are expected to participate in <u>all fundraising activities</u> of the Greek Folk Dance Ministry.
- 6. Dancers who have excessive absences may be subject to removal from the program.
- 7. All practices will be CLOSED. This means no parents, families, or friends may be in the practice room during practice times. This rule does <u>not</u> apply to Liondaria, the non-competitive group.
- 8. The Folk Dance Festival (FDF) will take place February 15-18, 2024. Both the location and format are <u>unknown</u> at this time. The dancer and parent(s) must determine by November 12, 2023 if they will attend FDF. Dancers who elect not to go to FDF may only participate in dance practices through the end of December.
- 9. The dancer and parent(s) agree to meet all financial responsibilities assigned to the participants by the St. John Greek Folk Dance Ministry and FDF.
- 10. Registration fees are:
 - a. Competitive Dance Groups: \$125 per dancer, or \$100 for each additional sibling, due by <u>September 24</u>. (*No registrations will be accepted after this date.*)
- b. Liondaria (non-competitive) Dance Group: \$75. (Must be at least 4 years old by September 30.)
- 11. Registration can <u>only</u> be accepted when all of the following are turned in:
 - a. Registration form
 - b. Non-refundable registration fee
 - c. Proof of Baptism/Chrismation (unless verified by Father John)
 - d. Stewardship Commitment Card (unless verified by Church Office)
- 12. Dancers from previous years must re-register. <u>Dancers are prohibited from practice until their</u> registration is complete and until their parent(s) become Steward(s) for 2023.
