From Father John

Beloved in Christ:

With Summer upon us, many of us will be traveling to favorite or new destinations. Our Church calendar reminds us that – if we are mindful through our active prayer, worship and sacramental life during these months – our Lord Jesus Christ, His Holy Mother the Theotokos,

and His Saints and Angels will journey with us, guiding us toward the Kingdom of God!

The Ecclesiastical Year will conclude in August, with the Great Feasts of *the Transfiguration of our Savior on August 6* and finally, *the Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos on August 15.* Although the actual events on which these two feasts are based occurred many years apart, with the former recorded in the Holy Gospels and the latter according to the Holy Tradition of the Orthodox Church, both feasts share the common focus on the glory of God and His Kingdom – especially as it relates to our sanctification and union with Him (theosis).

The Synoptic Gospels record similarly the powerful narrative of our Lord's Transfiguration on Mount Tabor (Matthew 17:1-9, Mark 9:2-9, Luke 9:28-36): Shortly before His Passion, "Jesus took with Him Peter and James and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain apart. And He was transfigured before them, and His Face shone like the sun, and His garments became white as light." Jesus appeared together with the Holy Prophets Moses and Elijah (Elias), showing that He was both the Giver and fulfillment of the Law received by Moses and, as Elijah was taken from the Earth to



Heaven in a chariot, He would soon overcome death by His Death, Resurrection and Ascension into Heaven. Jesus' Transfiguration revealed to His Disciples the fulness of His Divine glory, as the Voice of God the Father affirmed at this sublime event. "It was not the time of the consummation of the world, nor for the Saints to take possession of the hope promised to them; for as Paul says, He will change our humble body into the likeness of His – that is Christ's – glorious Body (Philippians 3:21)." (St. Cyril of Alexandria, Commentary on the Gospel of St. Luke, Homily 51) The Son of God came in the flesh to restore the glory of all humans – as we were created in God's image, with the potential to become like Him in glory. Further, we read in the Holy Scriptures and confess in our Creed our belief that the General Resurrection will occur at the time of our Lord's Second Coming.

There is one exception among us humans: From infancy, the Virgin Mary lived with complete love for, and wholehearted obedience and service to God; throughout her life, she lived according to the will of God, to please Him and in preparation for His Kingdom. After our Lord's Ascension into Heaven, the Panagia, beginning on Pentecost Sunday, also participated in the Apostolic mission of bringing the Good News of the Risen Christ to the world. She remained with St. John in Ephesus, then journeyed to Antioch to encourage St. Ignatios, and later to St. Lazaros in Cyprus: On her way there she arrived at the shores of Mount Athos, where she converted pagan virgins and foretold this would become a Holy Mountain for monks.



Finally, upon returning to Gethsemane after her travels, she received the consoling news from an Angel that her departure from this life into Heaven was imminent. The Holy Apostles were wondrously carried upon clouds from the ends of the Earth and gathered in Gethsemane for her repose – all but St. Thomas. On the third day after the Virgin's burial, the Apostle Thomas was carried upon a cloud from India to a place above her tomb: From there he witnessed the translation of the Holy Mother's glorified Resurrected body into Paradise. "She alone in her body, glorified by God, now enjoys the celestial realm together with her Son . . . (and) she only is the frontier between created and uncreated nature, and there is no man that shall come to God except he be truly illuminated through her." (St. Gregory Palamas,



Homily on the Dormition)

Beloved, in every Divine Liturgy, and especially as we partake of Holy Communion, we are transformed by grace from sinful humans into the children of God, and united with Christ and His Saints in His Kingdom! May we continue on this path to glory this Summer and, moreover, throughout our lives!

Stewardship and Community Outreach

This Summer we will mark three important occasions. *On July 4,* Americans celebrate the 248th Anniversary of our Country's Independence, representing a transformation from old laws to new freedoms, including religious choice.

In August, we celebrate two of the Major Feasts of our Orthodox Church: *The Transfiguration of Jesus Christ (August 6)* and the Dormition of the Theotokos (August 15).

The Transfiguration recounts the transformation of our Lord, Who revealed Himself in all His radiant glory to Peter, John and James, and thereby to all of us.

The Dormition recalls the Falling Asleep in the Lord of our Holy Mother and the taking up of her glorified physical body into the Heavens, a transformation from life on Earth to life in Eternity.

The dictionary defines Transformation as a thorough or dramatic change in form or appearance. Our outlook on Stewardship can and should be a transformation as we contemplate its meaning in our lives. In Christ, we are a new creation, transformed by the Holy Spirit. Our generosity is an opportunity to express how we have been transformed by our life in Christ.

Archbishop Anastasios of Albania has noted: "We find ourselves by offering ourselves. Have we learned the blessedness of generously giving to others of all we have?" He continues: "One day, a person complained to his priest that the Church and Christianity is one continual 'give, give, give." To which the priest replied, "Thank you very much for the finest definition of Christianity I have ever heard. You're right, Christianity is all about a constant 'give, give, give.' God giving His only Son to the world to show His unconditional love. His Son Jesus giving His life on the Cross to forgive our sins and destroy death. Then our Lord's Disciples giving all they had to make sure God's Good News of love was preached to all people everywhere. They not only gave away their homes and businesses, but even gave up their lives as Martyrs in gratitude to God! It is by offering our blessings back to God that He will be able to continue His forgiving, healing, liberating, empowering, transfiguring, loving ministry through the Church. For God, Infinite though He is, has chosen to work through us, through our gifts, to continue His saving work in the world today."

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

July, for the Ladies Philoptochos Society, is a planning and scheduling month. We will have a fun potluck meeting (TBA) to get a head start on the plans for 2024-2025. Now is the time to let me know if you have heard of a wonderful nonprofit that may need our assistance, or if you

During this event we serve at 10 different CCSD locations across the valley where volunteers unload pallets of food and hand those items out to our drive through and walk-up clients. We do not have any age restrictions for this volunteer event, so everyone is welcome to join, we just ask that anyone under the age of 16 is accompanied by an adult.

"Overall, each month, we distribute over 400,000 lbs. of groceries to about 20,000 people across all our programs. Our volunteers are our greatest asset, and we cannot make the impact that we do without them, so thank you again for reaching out to set something up with us."

Our community will be working the POP UP AND GIVE at Spring Valley High School. We will be sending a Sign-up genius for our Philoptochos members to sign up for the event. However, we will need the help of ALL our St. John Church Community for this effort – GOYA, OFF, Church School, Greek Folk Dance, Young Adults, Kali Parea, Mr. and Mrs., Forerunners, Parish Council Members (Did I get everyone?). 

From Father Florin

In the Orthodox Tradition, an elder is not simply a person of advanced age. An elder is someone who has attained the highest rank of spiritual struggle. When a person ascends to that height, the fruits of his many years of fasting and prayer vigils become readily apparent. St. Paisios of Mount Athos, whom we commemorate on July 12, was such a person. "He had wisdom from above. Although uneducated, took his place among the chorus of ecumenical teachers. His words were wise, his advice was sweeter than honey, his love with which he embraced every person was divine, his mind and heart emitted the illuminating grace of the Holy Spirit. In his person we came to know holiness in all of its depth and width. His words were words of eternal life. graceful jokes were full of wisdom delight." (Metropolitan Nicholas of Fthiotidos)

St. Paisios was born in 1924 in the humble village of Farasa in Cappadocia, Asia Minor (modern day Turkey). He was Baptized by St. Arsenios the Cappadocian, who foretold his life as a monk. A week following St. Paisios' Baptism, the Greeks were forced to leave Asia Minor, so his family settled



in Epiros. It is interesting to note that it was Elder Paisios who later wrote about the life of St. Arsenios. Early in his life, St. Paisios gravitated toward the spiritual life, spending hours daily in prayer. During World War II, he served in the military as a radio operator. In 1950 he went to Mount Athos, where he remained for most of the rest of his life, growing in spiritual stature through prayer, fasting, and many ascetical practices. In 1979 he moved to his final home, the Panagouda Hermitage. Here, he received tens of thousands of pilgrims, granting them, by God's grace, healing, advice, wisdom, and solace. He reposed in the Lord on July 12, 1994, and was canonized a Saint in 2015.

St. Paisios was an example of a person dedicated to God, by removing his personal aspirations and personal wills. Obedience, exercise, humility, piety, decency and, above all, love and long-suffering, were a way of life for him, but also lessons for those who sought a reason for consolation or a solution for their personal problems. The Elder attached great importance to thoughts. He always said that everything starts out with good thoughts, which are suppressing the bad ones. Let us think positively about our fellow man rather than negatively, because otherwise cunning and obstinacy bear down on man. In fact, he said not to trust our own thoughts and to give space to God's will, because anyone who does this comes out ahead. He used to say: "Humility is acquired after struggles. When you know yourself, you acquire humility, which becomes a (permanent) condition. Otherwise, one can become humble for a moment, but your thought will




say to you that you are something, although in reality you are nothing. And you will be deluded like that to the moment of death. If death finds you with the thought that you are nothing, then God will speak. If, however, your thought says at the hour of death that you are something and you do not understand it, all your effort goes to waste."

Of course, prayer was at the center of St. Paisios' life. He was teaching that we should ask for repentance in our prayer and "nothing else, neither for divine lights, nor miracles, nor prophecies, nor spiritual gifts – nothing but repentance. Repentance will bring you humility, humility will bring you the Grace of God, and God will have in His Grace everything you need for your salvation, or anything you might need to help another soul."

Prayer must be simple, because "things are very simple, and there is no reason why we should complicate them. If we regard matters in this way, we will feel the Jesus Prayer as a necessity and will not grow weary. We will be able to repeat it many times and our heart will feel a sweet pain, and then Christ Himself will shed His sweet consolation inside our heart." If done the right way, "prayer does not tire but invigorates. It is tiresome only when we do not enter its meaning and do not understand the sense given it by our Holy Fathers. Once we comprehend the need of God's mercy, the desire of this hunger will compel us, without pressuring ourselves in prayer, to open our mouth like a nursing infant, and we will feel, simultaneously, all the security and joy of a baby in its mother's embrace."

Let us sum up with a "contemporary" advice from a contemporary Saint: "Now that conveniences have exceeded all bounds, they have become inconveniences. Machines have multiplied; distractions have also multiplied, and man has been made into a machine. Machines and iron order men around, which is why their hearts have become as hard as steel." Through the prayers of St. Paisios, Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.



We have faced some unexpected challenges this June, including a costly \$12,000 repair for our fountain pump, \$1,000 for irrigation valve and time clock replacements, and \$5,500 for sidewalk repairs. It has been a tough month financially.

We also have an urgent matter regarding Panos Hall. Many of you have enjoyed fellowship in Kokkos Hall recently, but both of our a/c units – one 25-ton and one 15-ton – are in need of full replacement. Given our recent experience replacing two 25-ton units for the Church, we know this will be a significant expense, estimated to exceed \$60,000. With Summer upon us and our Food Festival just around the corner, this is a priority.

Our buildings, being over 25 years old, frequently present us with unexpected expenses, and these costs are only increasing. We rely heavily on the incredible generosity and support of our community to manage these financial burdens.

This is where we need your help. Your contributions, no matter the size, are vital. Together, we can ensure our facilities are in top shape for our upcoming events and for the enjoyment of all.





All-blessed one, you loved the Christian faith of your mother, and you convinced your father to convert and adopt it. You therefore received the grace from God almighty, O holy one, great and glorious Panteleimon the Martyr, to cure the illnesses of the sick who implore you with reverence and ardent faith.
