From Father John

Beloved in Christ:

Please pardon the mess! As I write my monthly message I am at a loss for words, as I had fully expected the scaffolding to be dismantled, the new iconography to be adorning our exedra walls and the full-house capacity

seating – as always – to be available in the nave for Great and Holy Week. Yet, due to circumstances beyond my control (or understanding), I am in the position of humbly requesting your pardon, your patience, your cooperation with this inconvenience and, most especially, your continued prayers.

Similarly, as we conclude our forty-day Lenten fast and prepare for our journey to our Lord Jesus Christ's Passion and Resurrection, we most likely are beseeching Him to pardon our own personal messes! Indeed, Christ came into the world when we were not at our personal best, but quite the contrary: As Holy Week will again reveal to us, the glorious



praises of "Hosanna!" offered to the Messiah on Palm Sunday will quickly evolve into the false accusations and convictions to "Crucify Him!" In like manner, we will enter the most sacred week of the year spiritually ill-prepared, for our lack of genuine repentance and our refusal to love and forgive those who have offended us – even though it is for all of us that Christ cries out His last words from the Cross, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34)

The saving message of Holy Week is this: Our Lord loves us not because we deserve His love, but because HE IS LOVE. "In this is love, not that we loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the expiation for our sins." (1 John 4:10) Thank you, Lord and Master, for by Your voluntary Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection, You have pardoned – and continue to pardon – our sins! "We worship Your Passion, O Christ. Show us now Your glorious Resurrection." (Fifteenth Antiphon of Holy Thursday Evening)

Lord, pardon our mess! If we come to the Holy Week services with the right disposition, the inconveniences of our surroundings and the imperfections of our brothers and sisters will not annoy us – but rather, our focus will be on Christ, His powerful and ever-relevant words, His voluntary suffering and Crucifixion and, most importantly, HIS LOVE. His saving actions will be seen and understood as both personal and universal: Just as He dies for all, He also resurrects for all! "King and Lord, though You slept as a mortal, You rose in three days, raising up Adam from corruption and annulling death. O Pascha of immortality, salvation of the world!" (Exaposteilarion of the Resurrection)

Parish Council Report

Kalo Pascha! We want to first thank all the many volunteers who are stepping up with their time and talents to help with Holy Week and all the related activities such as the Palm Sunday Luncheon and the Agape Picnic. Your efforts, as always, provide a beautiful and meaningful experience for all during this most important season in our Church, and we greatly appreciate it. We are looking forward to a tremendous Holy Week and joining together to

worship in our Faith. We are also pleased and honored that His Eminence Metropolitan Gerasimos will be here over the Palm Sunday weekend to worship and celebrate with us. Please keep in mind that the *Palm Sunday Luncheon* will be held on *April 9* following Church services and the *Agape Picnic* will be held on *Pascha, April 16 starting at noon.* These are great events for fellowship so please come and join us. You can purchase tickets for both of these events through the Church Office or in Panos Hall during Fellowship on Sundays. On a less than pleasant note, when attending services and events during Holy Week, please do not store valuables in your cars and please keep them locked. In the past, we have had a few instances of cars being broken into. We have hired a security company to patrol the parking lot at all times during Holy Week, but please still take the necessary precautions.

We recently recognized and congratulated Father John on the 30th anniversary of his Ordination to the Priesthood with a surprise gift in Church and a surprise luncheon in Panos Hall following services. We are proud that 15 of those years have been in service to our Church here in Las Vegas and we want to thank Father John and Presvytera Maria for all they have done for our Community over the years. They have been tireless in their work and we are truly blessed to have them. We look forward to many more years with them leading our Parish. We also want to thank the Ladies Philoptochos, Members of the Parish Council and everyone else who worked so hard to put on the luncheon and honor Father John on this blessed milestone in his service to the Church. Also we need to give a shout out to the cooks: The luncheon was tremendous!

On another note, Father Matthew and his family will be leaving us in June to become the Priest of another parish, St. John the Baptist Greek Orthodox Church in Beaverton, Oregon. It is bittersweet for everyone in that we are extremely sorry to see him go; but at the same time we are tremendously proud that he will be receiving a parish of his own consisting of around 150 families. The new Parish is very fortunate, for they are receiving a great and energetic priest. We want to thank Father Matthew and Presvytera Annie for all of their work for and contributions to our community, especially with our youth, and wish them well in their future endeavors. We will truly miss them. A *farewell luncheon* and send off has been set for Holy Pentecost *Sunday, June 4*, in Panos Hall following services.

As Father Matthew departs, we will welcome his replacement in June, Seraphim Ramos, a soon-to-be graduate of Holy Cross Greek Orthodox Seminary. He is married and has a baby daughter. He has been described as energetic, and pious yet down to earth. We are looking forward to welcoming him and his family to our community. We are still awaiting the official word on Seraphim's ordination from His Eminence Metropolitan Gerasimos. I will keep you posted.

Pertaining to the Iconography, the latest is that it may take up to three more months before we can get the Iconographers back into the country to finish their work. As part of the process, an on-site inspection has to be conducted by someone from the Immigration Office out of Southern California to verify that we are a Church. We are being told that this alone might take up to two months or more. Thus, we are essentially on hold until this inspection is completed. We are working diligently on the matter with the help of one our parishioners who specializes in immigration issues. As stated last month, we are truly grateful for his efforts in helping us.

In the same vein, we still have the scaffolding up for the Iconography and unfortunately, it is too cost prohibitive to take it down and set it up again, so the decision was made to leave it in place. It would cost over \$10,000 to remove it and set it up again, yet around \$1,000 to \$1,500 to leave it until the Iconography is complete. Unfortunately, having the scaffolding up will make it somewhat difficult for Holy Week in that we lose around 150-200 seats inside the Church. The current plan is set up an overflow tent with chairs outside with live video and audio feed of the services for Holy Friday and Holy Saturday night and to put chairs for seating up in the choir loft.

To keep you informed, other projects we are presently working on include finishing the roof repairs, working on the landscaping to finish the massive landscaping project undertaken last summer, and finishing the work on the floors in Panos Hall. Most of the roof repairs have been completed. However, we still have a slight leak in the women's bathroom ceiling in the Narthex. This was not part of the original bid and is presently in process of being fixed as well. On the landscaping, we have completed replacing the remaining deficient watering pipes, have almost completed weeding and putting decorative rock in the planters around the entire property, and are in the process of filling in and leveling off the holes in the grass in the large field and re-seeding it. Of particular note about the water pipes, by fixing them, we have already saved thousands of dollars on our water bill. As to the floors in Panos Hall, we finished the project; however, some of the urethane that was applied near the periphery of hall, clouded up while drying. We will need to sand out those small areas and reapply the urethane. The rest of the floor looks good.

As we proceed through this Lenten period, and celebrate Pascha, it is important to remember Stewardship. We ask that you look into your heart, pray, and give back accordingly to help our Church in this coming year. We absolutely have to get Stewardship fully on track where it covers most if not all of our operating expenses. So please help with the effort and contribute.

Other important milestones include this year's Greek Food Festival which will be held the weekend of September 15 through 17. We are fully immersed in the planning process and will be starting the Festival meetings for further planning soon. Please keep a look out for the dates and please step up and help. Our goal is get better every year and to provide a high-energy, well-attended event. Also we are planning a New Year's Eve Party to be held this year in Panos Hall with live music (Greek and American), great food, lots of dancing and fun, and no speeches. This event will also serve as part of the initial plan to help retire the Mortgage. It is our intent to make this the best event to hang out for New Year's Eve, so mark your calendars.

In closing and as usual, we want to again thank the various Church ministries and organizations, and the many individuals for all the work they do and have done to help us secure the future of the Church for ourselves and most importantly, our children. It clearly takes a lot of work from the entire community to maintain our Church. Please step forward whenever you can and pitch in. We know a lot things are always happening; but, they are extremely important. Please get involved as we move forward to make our Church better. May God bless.



From Father Matthew

The theme of last month's Youth Lenten Retreat was, "Walking with our Lord: A Journey through Holy Week." For Orthodox Christians, Holy Week is a spiritual journey. There are numerous services which guide us to our Lord and to His saving acts, His Crucifixion and Resurrection.

Through the hymns we take part in that final week of Jesus' earthly life: His triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, His final meal with the disciples, His prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, His betrayal, torture, and death, His destruction of Hades, and His glorious Resurrection. The beauty of the Holy Week services makes it almost impossible to not be affected, when we see Jesus' Cross carried in the Church, when we process around the Church with candles and His Tomb, when we stand in a darkened Church awaiting the light of Christ.

There is a reason for all of this. It is not simply theatrics – like some dramatic reenactment or an Easter play. Holy Week is not an invitation to watch, to be a spectator in the services, merely witnessing the actions unfold; rather *Holy Week is an invitation to participate*, to walk with our Lord. Through His saving actions He paved the path to our salvation – *our* path to salvation. It is a path not only trod by Christ, but one which we must also walk.

Just as Jesus was betrayed by His own disciple, He warns us that, "brother will betray brother." (Mark 13:12)

When He prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane, He asked God the Father's will to be done. Likewise He teaches us to pray, "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." (Matthew 6:10)

Just as He was persecuted and abused by the Roman soldiers, so He says, "They will lay their hands on you and persecute you." (Luke 21:12)

Our Lord stood unashamed before Pontius Pilate. So too He admonishes us, "Whoever is ashamed of Me and My words . . . of him will the Son of man also be ashamed . . . " (Mark 8:38)

Just as He was hated by the Jewish leaders and the people, so He warns, "You will be hated by all for My Name's sake." (Mark 13:13)

As Jesus bore the burden of His heavy Cross, so He tells us, ""If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." (Mark 8:34)

Just as He was Crucified, he tells us through the Apostle Paul, "Those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires." (Galatians 5: 24)

The path that Jesus Christ paved for our salvation is the very path which we, as followers of Christ, must follow. Holy Week is a special opportunity for us to take part in this journey. If we listen closely to the hymns that are being sung throughout, we will see our part in this. Let us be emboldened by our Lord's example and take up the same journey – for He will walk with us if we do, He will share our burdens, and He will grant us resurrection and eternal life.

Can you believe that it is this wonderful time of year again? Pascha is just around the corner. There are so many beautiful services; we hope to see our youth during the weekly services. We are still collecting for "Mochas for Missions." The collection will *end on Palm Sunday, April 9* (though I will not turn away money for our mission Churches if you come to me later). I will be handing out treats in our classes for the students that bring coins in their cups.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Glory be to God for all things! When the Lord was asked which commandment was the first of all the commandments, He responded, "The first is, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:29-31) During the



Lenten season we are called upon to make greater efforts to achieve these two commandments through prayer, fasting, asking for forgiveness, repentance/confession, humbling ourselves and offering alms to those less fortunate of the Lord's children.

Many of us have heard the expression: Actions speak louder than words. St. James the Apostle demonstrates this when he says to us in his epistle, "I by my works will show my faith." (James 2:18) His works are actions of love as noted above by the Lord. We too must perform these works of love as part of our life in Christ. Come Judgment Day, when we are facing the Lord and answering for our sins and actions in this life, to determine whether we will be on His right side with the sheep or on His left side with the goats:

- The Lord will not ask us what fancy restaurants we went to; He will ask us how many of His children did we feed.
- The Lord will not ask us what fine wines or expensive beverages we had in our homes; He will ask us how often did we take care of the thirst of His children.
- The Lord will not ask us about the elegant and fashionable clothes we had in our closets; He will ask us how many of His children did we clothe.
- The Lord will not ask us how many friends we had; He will ask us how many of His children we befriended that is, how many strangers we took in.
- And the Lord will not ask us what medical insurance plan we had or who our defense lawyer was; He will ask us how many of His children did we visit when they were sick, suffering or in captivity.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we hope and pray that each and every one of us will be able to glorify the Lord through our faithful and loving works, to the benefit of His Church and His children. May you be blessed in this Lenten season and attain the joy of His Kingdom. May everything we do be for His Glory.




